Points of Pride

- Over 1500 students enrolled in a CTE course, representing 40% of the total high school population
- Over 130 students participated in state leadership organizations such as DECA (Distributive Education Clubs of America), HOSA (Health Occupations Student Association), Skills USA, or BPA (Business Professionals Association).
- Four students participated in week-long career-related programs offered such as “Future Docs” at Michigan State University, “Pharmacy Camp” at University of Toledo and Dental Exploration at University of Detroit-Mercy
- Over 70 Pharmacy Tech students completed internships hours with our business partners, CVS and Walgreens
- The Pharmacy Tech Program was selected to represent Macomb County at the annual CTE Showcase in Lansing for legislators and Governor Snyder
- One Automotive Technology student was selected as one of 22 students statewide for a Breaking Traditions Award, an outstanding student in a non-traditional program
- Over 150 students completed the requirements to earn an industry certification in ASE Automotive, Cosmetology, Certified Nurse Assistant, or Emergency Medical Technician (EMT).
- The American Society of Body Engineers selected a SMTEC student to receive “Best of School” award for his automotive design
- Visual Imaging students were recognized in the “Top 5%” award category in the North American International Auto Show Poster Contest
- SMTEC Culinary Arts Programs won both first and second places at the Michigan Schools & Government Credit Union Dessert Competition

2013-2014 Follow-Up Survey of 2012-13 Completers

(N=309) 75% completion rate

- 70% are continuing their education
- 51% are at the community college, of which 50% are pursuing their related field
- 45% are at the university level, of which 48% are pursuing their related field
- 4% are at other post-secondary institutions
- 86% are employed, of which 60% are in their related field
