It is hard to believe that the first 15 weeks of the 2022-2023 school year have already been completed! The first quarter is always a busy time as staff and students are learning about each other, establishing routines and learning expectations. Each of our buildings took time at the beginning of the school year to

focus on building community and culture to welcome our Spartan students back. This initiative will continue throughout the school year to make sure that we are focusing on the needs of the whole student.

In addition to our focus on community building, we are also focusing on our curriculum and instruction. FPS continues our 1-1 technology initiative where all students in grades K-12 receive an electronic device that they are able to take home with them each day. Our teachers are continuing to utilize the Google Classroom platform for student learning and communication. 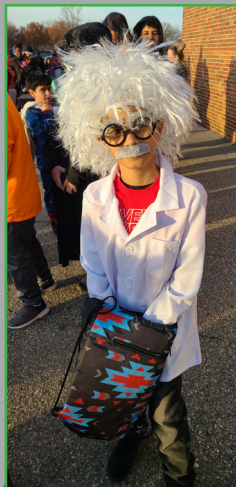
Senior Citizen Luncheon

The Fitzgerald Health Center is part of the Henry Ford Health System's Department of Pediatrics, School-Based and Community Health Program. The health center provides treatment of minor illness and injury, physical exams, immunizations (vaccinations), health education, confidential services, and mental health services including individual counseling. **There are no out-of-pocket costs.** Services are provided to youth through 21 years old regardless of insurance status or ability to pay. If your family needs health insurance, insurance application assistance can be provided. A signed consent form is required for your child to receive services. Influenza and COVID-19 vaccines are now available!



Normal hours are Monday-Thursday 8:30am-noon & 1pm-4pm, and Friday 8:30am-12:30pm.

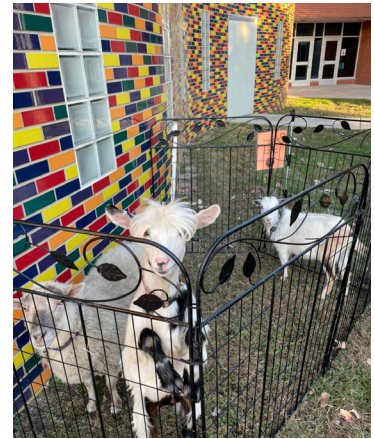

Mound Park Outdoor Classroom

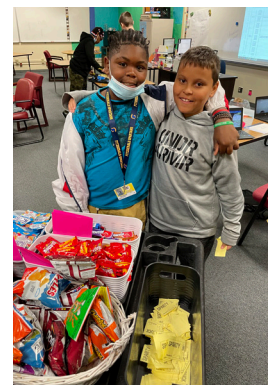
